The Community Arts Program creates opportunities for individuals and groups to learn about, participate in, and enjoy quality arts programming created and performed by seasoned and emerging artists and local arts groups. The program began with the 2011 renovation and opening of the Bernie Wohl Center. Since then, the Program has grown rapidly, from just a few events to hundreds of performing and visual arts performances, workshops, and classes a year.

Goddard Riverside's Bernie Wohl Center, at 91st and Columbus Avenue, is home to the Community Arts Program. Its versatile auditorium functions as a concert hall, theater in the round, dance performance space, art gallery, and film screening room. Visiting artists love the acoustics and the many classrooms, which can be used for meetings and rehearsals.

After school and during the summer, The Bernie Wohl Center hums with activity from the many children who attend its out-of school-time programs.

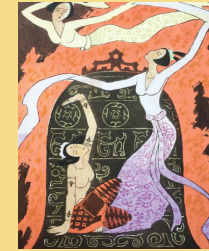
W.H.A.M. HIGHLIGHT
