Goddard Riverside and the Publishing Community: A Short History

The publishing connection to Goddard Riverside dates back to 1987, when New York was struggling with a rise in homelessness, and particularly in people with mental illness living on the streets.

A board member reached out to a publishing executive for help supporting Goddard's homeless outreach—and the Book Fair was born. The Fair continued for more than 36 years, and the partnership it created lives on in many ways.

In 2002, Goddard Riverside's Book Fair Committee held the first annual Book Fair Gala, which evolved into the Bash. Past honorees have included Len Riggio, Dick Robinson and Carolyn Reidy. The publishing community has raised millions of dollars for Goddard, and in addition many individuals from the industry have served on Goddard's board and committees. They have played, and continue to play, a huge role in shaping our evolution.

In 2017 we awarded the first Goddard Riverside Stephan Russo Book Prize for Social Justice. Named for a book-loving former Executive Director, the prize honors the power of the written word to create a more just society. We've since added the Goddard Riverside CBC Youth Book Prize for Social Justice to honor books for children and youth.



The Goddard Riverside Stephan Russo Book Prize for Social Justice




Children of the State: Stories of Survival and Hope in the Juvenile Justice System, by Jeff Hobbs (Scribner)

Jeff Hobbs challenges any preconceived perceptions about how the juvenile justice system works—and demonstrates that no one so young should ever be considered irredeemable.





An indictment of America's housing policy that reveals the social engineering underlying our segregation by economic class, the social and political fallout that result, and what we can do about it.




Poverty, By America, by Matthew Desmond (Crown/ Penguin Random House)

An expert on elder justice maps the challenges of aging, how things go wrong, and presents powerful tools we can use to forge better long lives for ourselves, our families, and our communities.




The People's Hospital: Hope and Peril in American Medicine, by Ricardo Nuila (Scribner)

Goddard Riverside Invests In People to Strengthen Community

Goddard Riverside and the Stanley M. Isaacs Neighborhood Center, our strategic partners on the Upper East Side, work together to provide comprehensive programs for all ages.

Preparing Children and Youth for Success

Our programs for children support the whole family. When parents can rely on affordable, enriching environments for their children such as our **Early Childhood Centers**, **After School**, **Summer Camps** and **Beacon Programs**, they're able to work and invest in their children's futures. We're also here for children who need a little extra support, such as tutoring at **Star Learning Center**. The **Rise Youth Center** provides a friendly and enriching space for children and teens. **#DegreesNYC** is co-leading a movement to break down barriers to higher education.

Supporting Self-Sufficiency and Financial Independence

Our **Education and Workforce** programs provide training to help people launch steady and well-paid careers. The **Options Center** helps young people get into, and complete, college, while the **Options Institute** trains professionals in college access and success counseling. **Learning to Work** helps high schoolers finish school and move on to a job or further education.

Enriching the Lives of Older Adults

Studies show that most older adults want to live in their own homes. We help people "age in community" to reduce the risk of isolation and loneliness. Our **Older Adult Centers**, **older adult housing**, **nutrition** programs and **Naturally Occurring Retirement Communities (NORCs)** offer recreation, learning opportunities, meals and other support to help people stay active and healthy. Our programs help older adults experience an optimal quality of life and stay connected to the community.







Promoting Behavioral Health and Wellness

Due to the stigma they face in our society, many people living with mental illness tend to isolate themselves. Our programs help them break through that isolation and connect with community. The ACT Team is a mobile clinic that serves people with severe mental illness so that they can live and thrive in the community. The TOP Clubhouse, TOP Opportunities and Green Keepers help people move along a path to greater skills and stronger networks, eventually leading to full-time work and





integration with the community. Goddard Riverside supports Individuals experiencing behavioral health challenges to maximize their abilities and reach their fullest potential.

Supporting Housing for All and Fighting Homelessness

Goddard Riverside pioneered many of the most effective approaches to ending homelessness. We were among the first organizations to establish **street outreach** teams, which help people move from chronic homelessness to permanent housing. Today we are one of three nonprofits that work together to provide homeless outreach to all of Manhattan. We offer **transitional and supportive housing** to help people move from life on the street to living in their own permanent home. Our **Law Project** prevents homelessness by educating, organizing and representing tenants facing eviction or harassment.

Strengthening Families and Communities

These programs help people amplify their voices – to express themselves artistically, or to claim their rights. Our **Community Arts** program hosts an intensive summer performing arts conservatory for youth, plus a year-round schedule of arts performances and classes. The **Resource Center** helps people secure the government benefits they're qualified for, and offers legal and financial counseling, referrals and more. **Advocacy and Organizing** supports people to advocate for a more just society. Our innovative **Soup's Up** program fights hunger while providing culinary training to young people.

We envision a world where communities are fair and just and people have the resources and tools to create healthy, safe and thriving lives.






