About Options

Options at Goddard Riverside

The Options Center is one of many programs provided by Goddard Riverside. For over 30 years, Options has been working to increase the number of underrepresented young people who gain access to college and earn quality postsecondary degrees.

Options College Counseling

The Access program supports New York City students through the whole college access process, from identifying postsecondary options to choosing an academic and financial good-fit. Over 250 high school juniors, seniors, and young adults are served yearly.

Through the Success program students receive one-to-one advising through college graduation. Services include counseling on and off campus, college supplies, grants to pay for textbooks, and transportation aid to and from college.

Options Institute

The Options Institute has drawn on the experience and knowledge of the counseling program to offer training to school and community-based professionals.

In the late 1990s, the Options Center received funding to replicate its college access model at four NYC non-profits. Informed by the needs of the staff at those new centers, the first Options Foundation for College Access Counseling Certificate Course was developed and offered publicly in 2005. Today, the hallmark program of the Institute continues to be the certificate Foundation Course. The course covers both the basic knowledge needed to help young people through the college process and the fundamental counseling skills and youth development approaches crucial to working with students.

Options Institute is New York City's leading provider of professional development in college access.

Options Institute's Approach

All Options Institute facilitators are also college counselors who bring their own first-hand experience and knowledge to seminars. We train from a practical perspective, using thoughtfully crafted curricula to provide intensive, interactive learning experiences. Committed to adult learning theory, we help participants build on what they know and immediately apply what they learn. Participants leave every training course with helpful resources to take their learning beyond the workshop. Since our inception, the Options Institute is proud to have served over 9,000 participants in the New York City area as well as Chicago, Puerto Rico and Portland, Oregon.

Foundation Course for College Access Counseling—Certificate Course

Counseling Series (\$350)

The Counseling Series sessions focus on building positive relationships with young people through strong communication skills, useful observation, effective feedback and unconditional positive regard.

Youth Development in College Access

Participants are introduced to the theoretical and practical underpinnings of strong college access programs. Participants examine their own program components to determine if they follow youth development best practice including aspects of resources, space and processes. Through group discussion and example scenarios, participants identify tools and opportunities to strengthen their college access programs.

College Access Counseling Skills

Effective college access work requires strong counseling and communication skills. Participants delve into active listening, probing and informing skills, all needed to work effectively with young people. Participants learn an approach that puts the young person at the center, examine a range of common counseling responses and practice using effective skills in a range of situations. Participants engage in mock college counseling sessions and assess their own counseling skills and next steps.

Common Counseling Challenges Practicum & Culmination

Building on College Access Counseling Skills, participants spend the day practicing skills, giving feedback and discussing strategies in response to a variety of case scenarios concerning the college and financial aid processes. Drawn from real life situations, scenarios include, but are not limited to, students who consistently miss appointments or fail to do follow-up; students whose academic performance will not allow them to get into their dream college or pursue their dream career; and disagreement between parents and student about where they should attend college.

In closing, we will reflect on what was learned over the Foundation Course and Counseling Series and award certificates.

refugees and asylees all face different challenges in applying to, getting in to, and paying for college.


Guided by both lawyers from the Legal Aid Society and Options' trainers, participants examine strategies and resources to help immigrant students through the college application and financial aid processes.

Beyond Basics Advanced Counseling Series

Are you a graduate of our *Foundations Course*? Have been working in access for two or more years? Then our *Beyond Basics* series is for you. Workshops focus on building your communication skills and improving your interaction with others – both students and peers. What does it take to have a "real" conversation? How does your identity and privilege intersect and effect student success? How does the history of race in the United States effect your students' success? How do you recognize when a student has been exposed to trauma? Join your peers and build a professional network you can share ideas with and learn from.

Cultural Responsiveness in College Counseling

This session will look at bias in education and the ways identities and privilege intersect. Through activities and assessments participants will have the opportunity to reflect on their personal and programmatic commitments to a more inclusive and equitable workplace for staff, students, and students' families. Participants will discover how to develop their cultural competence and bring their genuine self to their work with students

Let's Talk Race

"Let's Talk Race" is an immersive workshop designed to illuminate the intricate interplay between historical contexts, racial trauma, and bias within the United States. Participants delve into the layers of American history, tracing the roots of systemic racism and its enduring impacts on marginalized communities. Through facilitated discussions and reflective exercises, attendees unpack the deep-seated biases ingrained in societal structures and personal perspectives. By confronting uncomfortable truths and acknowledging the ongoing legacy of racial trauma, this workshop empowers individuals to cultivate empathy, challenge preconceptions, and actively work towards fostering a more equitable and inclusive society.

Trauma Informed Awareness 101

In recent years trauma has become a popular (and necessary) discussion. Trauma responsiveness and trauma informed care practices are becoming common in hospitals, schools and other places of care. This Trauma Awareness training is designed to help counselors and educators understand the traumas their student experience and recognize signs of PTSD or C-PTSD their students may be exhibiting. We will examine the roles educators can play as witnesses, as perpetrators and as healers and design strategies to support students as well as staff.

Real Talk


